POST-SECONDARY OPTIONS WHERE TO START?

- Use the **myBlueprint** website
(instructions on how to set up account are posted on our website)
- Talk to people in programs or careers that you may be interested in pursuing
- Go to spend-a-days, career spotlights, open houses and information sessions (virtual this year)
- Meet with a school counsellor (University and/or College) to discuss options

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA

Admission Days

- Set days throughout the semester that students can apply online and save \$50 on application fee
- Students should take a picture of the transcript they received to upload when applying
- Dates for Admission Days will be sent out through Teams when available
- Consider Campion College

Application Deadlines

- March 15...Priority deadline for most programs
- Feb 15...Nursing ****apply through U of R****

Entrance Scholarship Deadline

- March 15

UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN

Admission

- Deadlines vary depending on the program
- Dates and deadlines are listed on their website.
- Many programs are Dec. 1 for early conditional

SASK POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTE

First Qualified/ First Admitted Programs

- used for the majority of programs
- apply as soon as you are enrolled in the required courses for your program

High Demand Programs

- programs with more applicants than spaces
- have admission requirements **plus** additional selection criteria
- application period is October 1 - February 15

Competitive Programs

- applications are ranked according to specific program requirements
- application period is October 1 - February 15

(Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing program)

POST SECONDARY RESEARCH

- Each university has their own website
- Entrance requirements and deadlines differ at each institution and can vary between faculty
- Students should familiarize themselves with dates and deadlines and set up an appointment if they have questions

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

UNIVERSITY EXPENSES

(ESTIMATE)

U of R (living at home)

- Application Fee: \$100
- Tuition Fee (10 classes): \$7190-\$8493
(tuition is based on the faculty the student is enrolled in)
- Books & Supplies: \$1000-\$3000
- Food: \$1000
- Miscellaneous: \$2500
(transportation, parking, personal, etc.)

TOTAL \$11 790 - \$15 093

U of S (living in residence)

- Application Fee: \$100
- Tuition Fee (30 credit hours): \$6865-\$8369
(tuition is based on the faculty the student is enrolled in)
- Books & Supplies: \$1000-\$3000
- Residence Fees: \$8050-\$8984
(with meal plan)
- Miscellaneous: \$2500
(transportation, parking, personal, etc.)

TOTAL \$18 515 - \$22 953

TRANSCRIPTS

- Once a student has applied, they must request their official transcripts from the Ministry of Education
- Instructions on how to request them are on our website or google Sask High School Transcripts

POST-SECONDARY AWARDS

The U of R has awarded more than 7.7 million dollars in scholarships and bursaries in a year

At the U of S, upwards of 10 million dollars is available every year, with 3.5 million dollars available to first year students

Sask Polytechnic provides approximately \$2 million in student awards every school year

AUTOMATIC ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS (U OF R)

Centennial Merit Scholarships

Average is calculated the same way as
Early Conditional Average

- 95.00% - 100% = \$3000
- 93.00% - 94.99% = \$1500
- 90.00% - 92.99% = \$1000

*A recalculation will be done automatically based on the student's
final, faculty specific admission average.*
